

Shorebird Steward Incentives & Raffle Details

Incentives help us to show our appreciation for all of our volunteers' hard work. Without your help, our shorebirds would undoubtedly suffer greater human disturbance. Please read below for more details on our incentive tiers and monthly raffle for the 2022 season.

Volunteer Incentive Tiers

- **Tier One:** 2 shifts > Your choice of Audubon sticker
- **Tier Two:** 3 shifts > Audubon koozie and an Audubon pin
- **Tier Three:** 4 shifts > Shorebird Steward eagle band and a reusable straw
- **Tier Four:** 6 shifts > One family pass to Beidler Forest
- **Tier Five:** 8 shifts or more > One reciprocal pass, valid for one year on date of distribution

Monthly Raffle

For every Post-Shift Survey submitted following a Steward Shift, volunteers get one entry into a drawing for a prize! Winners are drawn once a month at the end of the month from April-August. Prizes will be announced monthly and can include:

- A framed 8 x 10 photo of your choice, taken by Nolan Schillerstrom, Coastal Program Associate at ASC. Options include various birds and landscapes in South Carolina.
- One copy of Dana Beach's "Deveaux" a beautifully photographed and written "reflection on the life of a South Carolina sea bird rookery"
- Your choice of shirt from our Coastal inventory
- A canvas or metal mounted print of different birds in SC by Aaron Sanderson

The fine print: Rewards will either be delivered by the Stewardship Coordinator when in the area of the site or mailed to the volunteer--with the exception of the Reciprocity Pass which will be given to stewards reaching that tier at the end of the season. Exceptions may be granted if the volunteer is temporarily in South Carolina, but must be discussed with the Coastal Stewardship Coordinator. Shifts do not have to be worked at the same location in order to earn incentives. Incentives are valid as supplies last and can be changed at the discretion of Audubon South Carolina.
